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
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# THE AMERICAN UNIVERSITY OF ROME GRADUATE SCHOOL



This M.A. shapes a new breed of professionals in the arts management field by offering Liberal Arts, Humanities, Fine Arts, Film, Media, and Communication graduates the opportunity to acquire the appropriate management and business skills, thus enabling them to capitalize upon their previous grounding within the arts.

This M.A. Program aims to provide future professionals with an advanced knowledge of the contemporary art world, arts administration, and management. Graduates will be able to apply their knowledge and skills in the contemporary art market.

The combination of theory and practice of this M.A. in Arts Management enables graduates to pursue careers in museums and galleries, the art market, the heritage industry, art publishing, art conservation and teaching, journalism, and advertising. Alternatively, students may pursue further fields of research.

#### POLICIES FOR SUSTAINABLE PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION

The M.A. in Food Studies is a cross-disciplinary program that provides knowledge and skills on the current situation and developments surrounding sustainable food production and consumption, and on how we affect the Earth's resources with our food choices.

The goal of the M.A. Program in Food Studies is to provide students with knowledge, critical thinking, and transferable skills related to the global and local dimensions of sustainable food production and consumption, to the business of food, and to communicating about food.

Students with an M.A. in Food Studies will be able to pursue career goals that include: following a professional path leading to work in international and non-profit organizations or private sector companies; becoming an entrepreneur in the food business; working in communications and digital media related to food; or continuing on to further research-based work.

Rome is a global food hub.


AUR's location in Rome means direct and unique access to the following international organizations dealing with policies, programs, and treaties on food, agriculture and sustainable development at the global level:

# **MASTER IN PEACE STUDIES**

#### **RELIGIONS IN TIMES OF CONFLICT**

This program offers an interdisciplinary and methodologically diverse study of culture and religion in their political and social dimensions. The research and study of particular religious traditions, the social and political contexts in which they evolved, and the political ideas they influenced, contribute to the promotion of peace, religious and cultural diversity, crosscultural dialogue, understanding and cooperation.

Through this program, students will develop an understanding of various traditions that shaped many cultures of today's globalizing world. They will learn about religious and political ideas that are critical for understanding and resolving tensions and conflicts across the globe.

One of the key aims of the program is to equip future scholars and professionals with conceptual as well as practical tools for articulating a constructive role of religion in contemporary societies and for working in the areas of conflict resolution and intercultural and interreligious dialogue (especially in those societies in which particular religious traditions still have a strong impact on shaping the social, cultural and political spheres).

## Thesis (6 credits)

In order to complete the MA degree in Peace Studies: Religions in Times of Conflict, students are required to write an M.A. thesis that will expand their knowledge on a particular subject, and will prepare them for future professional work or research at the Ph.D. level.



# MASTER IN SUSTAINABLE CULTURAL HERITAGE

The greatest challenge facing cultural heritage is ensuring the long term preservation of our monuments, art treasures, historic buildings and cultural traditions. Threatened by decay, cutbacks in public spending, pressures from increased tourism, gentrification and climate change, the challenges have never been greater. This program shapes a new type of professional by offering Liberal Arts, Humanities and Social Science graduates the opportunity to acquire the practical skills necessary to become a heritage professional in the 21st century, building upon the skills and knowledge acquired in their first degree.

Sustainability requires that heritage sites are preserved and not allowed to decay, are adequately funded, and are embedded within a community that will care for them. The learning outcomes for this M.A. stem from these principles. Students will learn the business skills that will enable them to manage sites and raise funds, and to develop sites as tourist attractions in a way that is sympathetic to the site, attractive to the visitor and respectful to the local community. The role of heritage as part of cultural identity and the importance of engaging the local community in its stewardship are central themes of the program. Contemporary issues concerning the role of heritage in conflict zones, trafficking of art and antiquities and the potential use of heritage as part of international development initiatives are covered in core courses and electives.

Admission is on a competitive basis. Applications are accepted for Fall semester only.

#### INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

In general terms, the entry process and requirements for all our programs is very similar. However, each program requires a particular type of Bachelor degree or demonstrated experience of the subject. To view these individual requirements please visit www.aur.edu/gradschool. You can also apply online from the website.

#### **GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants for graduate study must have earned a Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution, having earned a minimum grade point average of 3.0 or equivalent.

All students who completed a Bachelor Program in a language other than English must demonstrate proficiency in English language by submitting the official test scores from TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) with a minimum score of:

- Paper-based: 550
- Internet-based: 80
- or from IELTS (International English Language Testing System): 6.5.

To apply for an M.A. program, students are required to submit documents showing their previous education at the B.A. level together with a transcript of all completed courses. Students are also required to submit their Curriculum Vitae and a motivation letter (minimum 700 words) that explains their interest in their selected program and their career goals, having carefully reviewed the courses that are offered. In addition, students are required to submit one letter of recommendation, preferably from their academic advisors or professors at the B.A. level.

Before admittance to the M.A. program, all students will be interviewed by the Program Director. Students are expected to demonstrate their commitment and capacity to study at the graduate level.

#### **APPLICATION DEADLINES**

Application Deadlines for Master's Programs (all Programs start in the Fall semester):

- Round 1: 01 February
- Round 2: 01 April
- Round 3: after 01 April (based on available spaces)

There will be a rolling admission after the Round 2 deadline if places are still available.

#### Deposit Deadlines for Master's Programs:

- Round 1: 01 March
- Round 2: 01 May
- Round 3: (upon acceptance)

# **Application Form**

A completed application form accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee of 60 Euros for citizens and permanent residents of countries other than United States or Canada or 80 US Dollars for United States citizens and permanent residents and Canadian citizens.





# **Official Transcripts**

Official university transcripts from all institutions attended. Applicants must have earned a minimum grade point average of 3.0 or equivalent.



# **Motivation Letter**

A motivation letter (minimum 700 words) that explains your interest in the M.A. Program and your career goals, having carefully reviewed the courses that are offered.



# **Recommendation Letter**

One letter of recommendation, preferably by one of your academic advisors or professors at the Bachelor's level.



# Curriculum Vitae

A complete curriculum vitae detailing your educational and work experience plus any voluntary positions.

Official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score Paper-based: 550 and Internet-based: 80, or from IELTS (International English Language Testing System) 6.5
